About California School for the Deaf

- CSD is an internationally acclaimed school for deaf children.
- The school is situated on 64 acres. Plenty of trees and grassy areas make it an especially attractive campus.
- Approximately 50% of the instructional staff is deaf, providing positive role models for students.
- Technology is incorporated into all aspects of the school--including multi-media work stations in every classroom, computer labs in every department, research opportunities utilizing Internet resources, and an instructional television studio on campus.
- The school has one of the finest career preparation programs in the state of California.
- CSD follows the California State Department of Education Curriculum Standards.
- Teachers and staff are fluent in American Sign Language and English.
- Communication services including spoken English/articulation, auditory training, speech reading, and communication strategies are provided.
- CSD is a place where deaf students can participate in practical and abstract activities that require higher level thinking skills and inspire personal growth.



Who can attend the California School for the Deaf? Deaf and hard of hearing children from 46 counties throughout Northern California, between the ages of 3 and 21.

What is the school's history with turning out successful graduates?

Many well-known, successful deaf people have graduated from CSD. A large percentage of CSD's graduates have gone on to higher education by attending Gallaudet University in Washington DC; National Technical Institute for the Deaf in Rochester, NY; California State University, Northridge; Ohlone College in Fremont, and other colleges and universities. The school's career/technical program trains students to be work force ready. Its career center guides students in making wise post graduate choices.

How does the school accommodate children who live too far away to attend on a daily basis? Approximately 60% of the students who attend CSD stay on campus during the week and go home each weekend. There is no cost to families for supervised living quarters, meals, or transportation.

What are some of the benefits my child will receive by attending CSD?

- Full access to a first rate accredited education program with credentialed teachers

- Leadership opportunities
- Personal development through interaction with deaf peers
- Rich language environment
- Excellent after-school activities that support leadership skills, scouting, job experience.

Does the school offer opportunities for students to participate in organized sports?

Yes. Students who attend CSD may participate in football, basketball, volleyball, baseball, softball, wrestling, cross country, track, swimming, and other activities.
